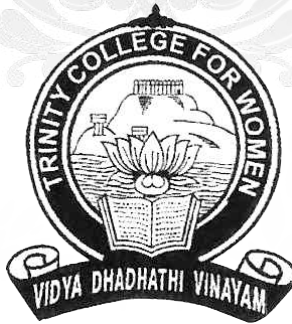

It is an additional course apart from our University syllabi.

Exam Cell:

Teaching and Evaluation are the two sides of a coin. Internal Examinations and External Examinations of Periyar University play a key role in the evaluation part. The Exam Cell in Trinity College for Women is headed by the Chief Superintendent of Examinations (Principal) with supporting staff. The Prime responsibility of Examination cell is conducting all examinations (Both Internal and External Examinations) in fair and systematic manner under the directions of The Controller of Examinations, Periyar University, Salem and the Chief Superintendent of Examinations of the College.

Equal Opportunity Cell:

The Equal Opportunity Cell was established in the College. The main aim of the Cell is related to staff members and students belonging to Persons with Disabilities, Schedule Castes/Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Communities, Minorities and the students of Economically Weaker Sections. Admission Committee:

Trinity Alumni Forum is an official platform of Trinity College for Women, Namakkal which provides a platform for nurturing a strong, reciprocal relationship between alumni, the community and the institute. The purpose of Alumni Forum is to foster the spirit of engagement with and strengthen the ties between all entities that have shared or continue to share a bond with TCW, the Alumni Forum provides opportunities to showcase and highlight recent and past successes of the old students, current students, staff, and the College. The College is hopeful of continued interaction session with the students either offline or online of yesteryears and desirous to provide a platform to access a variety of benefits and services through Alumni Relations, whether by way of renewed friendships, meeting fellow alumni in different fields, obtaining professional advice or recommendations, or providing avenues for those who are searching for new career opportunities.

Conferment of the Degree

- Has completed all the components prescribed under Parts I to Part V in the CBCS pattern to earn 140 credits.
- Has successfully completed the prescribed Field Work/ Institutional Training as evidenced by certificate issued by the Principal of the College.

Ranking
